Pettet Foundation's 21st Annual Golf Day: A Community Coming Together



The local community recently came together for the 21st Annual Pettet Foundation Golf Day at Eastwood Golf Club in Kilsyth, where over 120 golfers played an impressive 245 holes—all in the name of supporting children and families in crisis.

The Pettet Foundation, a Park Orchards-based charity, was established in 2001 in memory of the Pettet family—Bill, Cher, Rob, and Sharni—who tragically lost their lives in a car accident. The Pettets were deeply involved in the community, particularly at Park Orchards Primary School, and their legacy of generosity lives on through the foundation's work.

The golf day was more than just a round of golf; it was a day of connection, featuring nearest-the-pin competitions, spin the wheel, raffles, and a silent auction.

Adding to the excitement of the day, Pettet golfer, Brea Cousins, hit his first ever hole in one on the second hole at Eastwood Golf Course.

Most importantly, thanks to the generosity of participants and sponsors, it raised over \$25,000, which will go directly to helping families in urgent need.

"In the past year alone, we've received 43 applications and donated over \$41,000 to families in crisis," said Pettet Foundation Director, Cam Sutherland. "With the cost of living on the rise, we're seeing an increase in requests for support. It's heartwarming to see the community rally behind this event, as it means we can continue to help even more families throughout the year."

Time moves on but the crimes stay the same.

Manningham NHW was established 40 years ago. When we started, the two main crime types were residential burglaries and theft from motor vehicles. In 2025, these are still the two main types of crime that occur in Manningham.

Below are some hints on how you can reduce your chances of becoming a victim of these crimes.

Please take a few moments to brush up on the actions that you can take to improve your security.

Helpful hints for home security

Always lock all outside doors and windows when you go out, even if you are only going to be away for a few minutes.

Lock your external garage or garden shed doors with a quality key-operated lock or padlock.

If you go out at night, leave some internal lights and a radio on.

Trim trees and shrubs around windows.

Do not leave spare keys hidden outside your house. Give them to a trusted neighbour or friend.

If you are in the garden or watching TV, lock up parts of the house you can't keep an eye on.

Lock away ladders, garden tools and bicycles.

If you have a lot of jewellery, valuable documents, cash or other negotiable items, consider installing a safe and/or a burglar alarm.

Never leave notes for people telling them you are out and when you will be back.

Helpful hints for vehicle security

Remove the ignition key and lock the vehicle even if you will only be away from it for a short time.

Remove credit cards, and your Driver Licence and/or Registration papers from the glovebox. . .

Remove your mobile phone and any other valuables from the car when you park the vehicle, even at home.

If you have to leave valuables in your car lock them in the boot before you reach the parking spot.

Don't attach a spare key under the mudguard or some other easily accessible place on the vehicle.

At home if possible, park your car in a locked garage. Install a sensor light if you have to leave your car on the driveway.


If you have to park your car in the street at night, whenever possible, park under a street light.

Don't think that your car has to be shiny and new to be stolen. Older models are often stolen for parts.

Ring the Police on Triple Zero (000) immediately if you see anybody acting suspiciously in your area. (Report what you see but don't intervene.)

Unfortunately, the new centre will not be located on the Chalet land that many had hoped for, but we are pleased to announce that the council has acquired the site at 568 Park Road (between our current site and POPS) for the new community centre. There is still a long road ahead, and the council has many steps to complete before this project moves to community consultation. However, we are excited to see a space that reflects Park Orchards, its past, and its future, while providing welcoming and accessible spaces for everyone. Securing funding remains one of the biggest challenges. This is why I have hosted both Federal and State politicians at our centre, as well as in meetings, seeking funding support for the building costs. I often say that I know one day we will be cutting the ribbon, and that will be a day to celebrate with the Park Orchards community.
